Networking & Collaborating

We host programs throughout the year to educate health and human service professionals (and community members) about issues, best practices and resources to help. We also provide online resources to help people in our community understand issues and connect to services.

Creating Partnerships

Community partners work together to advocate for and impact change on a wider scale. Through Coordinated Entry, we are creating a more effective system of care for people in crisis. Individuals in need of assistance can make a single phone call to access more than 40 HUD-funded housing programs, as well as non-traditional assistance through nearly 100 partnering churches, schools, nonprofits and community organizations. Community Council staff also are involved in regional coalitions, other collaborative partnerships and advocacy efforts.

Collecting & Sharing Data

Accurate data is critical to informed decision making. As administrator for Coordinated Entry and the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), we have centralized service access and are now able to gather accurate data on homelessness and its contributing factors. We also conduct the annual HUD Point In Time Homeless Count, which is used nationally as the benchmark for homelessness data. Data collected, as well as community outcomes, are shared with federal, state and local government organizations, the Continuum of Care and partner agencies.

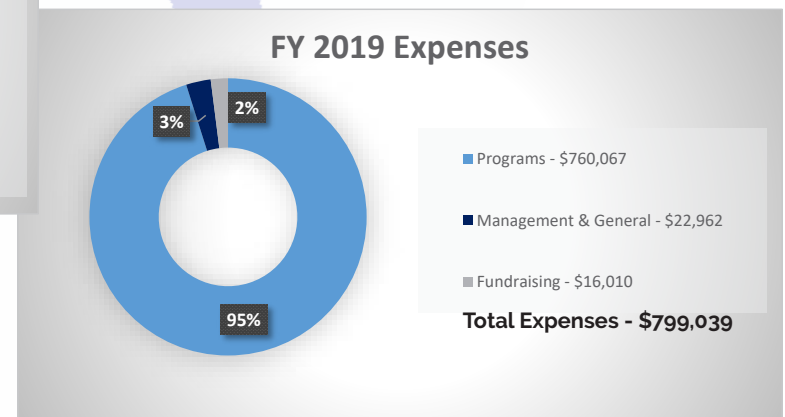
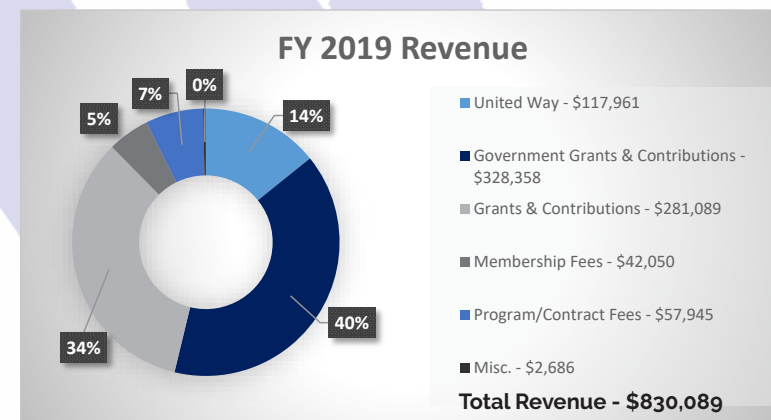
